

CSBG IMPACT FY 23

Not a program but a movement towards prosperity



CAP Utah supports nine Community Action Agencies across the state that combat the causes and conditions of poverty. CSBG funds are leveraged to address specific local needs through economic development, aging services, Head Start, Circles Initiatives, case management, food distribution, energy programs, financial education, free tax preparation (VITA), and housing programs.

WHAT HAPPENED IN FY 23?

- The network served **41,479 households** and **96,122 individuals**
- The network saw a **4% increase** in the number of households served and a **26% increase in the households of color**
- The network served **15% more households** in deep poverty, who pay rent, and have children.
- The network served fewer **persons with disabilities, seniors, and homeless households** due to decreases in resources for these groups.
- Agencies facilitated **375,783 hours of volunteer work** worth over **\$2,724,427** at minimum wage.
- **83% of those hours** were from persons with **low-income** - empowering persons to create change in their communities

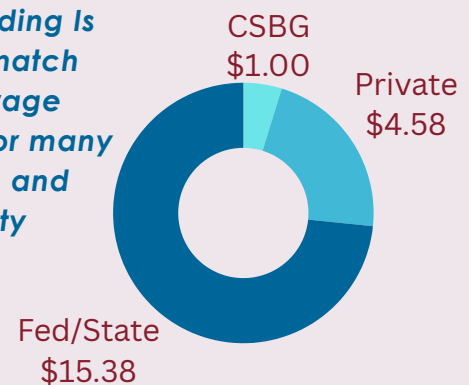
