DSDHH MISSION STATEMENT

DSDHH provides education, advocacy and accessible support services which enhance the quality of life for people who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing

The Employment Services Program under Division of Services for Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DSDHH) provides a variety of free services and support to meet the needs of employer staffing needs by connecting them to qualified and job-ready individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing. This program also provides preparation, placement and/or retention services to all deaf or hard of hearing individuals who are ready to be employed or are currently employed but experiencing challenges/issues in the workplace.

<u>FACT</u>: Workers with disabilities have LOWER rates of absenteeism than their peers.

Benefits of Hiring and Working With Deaf or Hard of Hearing employees:

- Equal or higher job performance rates
- Better quality and quantity of work
- Higher flexibility for working
- More focused on work and less likely to be distracted by socializing
- Higher retention rates
- Tax credits may be available
- Employees with disabilities represent a diverse customer base and give businesses appeal to a broader market base
- Employees tend to have good problem-solving skills due to lifetime experiences
- People with disabilities bring unique characteristics and skills to the workforce
